Jeffrey deeply regrets what happened. If the clock could be turned back and the situation reversed, what a beautiful world this would be. However, we must face reality. Jeffrey has been in prison almost nine years. The children have been without a father and I have been without a husband for all that time. We are still a family and love each other and pray for the day that Jeffrey will be reunited with us.


